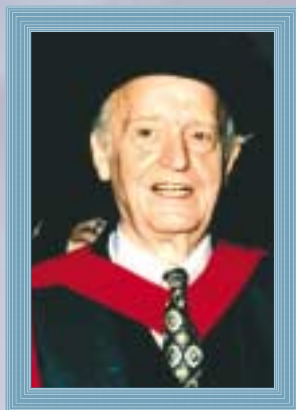


# In Memoriam

## The Rev. Dr Erik Kvan

(Hon DSocSc 1992), a scholar-priest who had lifelong commitment to academia and the community. Dr Kvan joined the University's Department of Psychology in 1952. He was Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences from 1968 to 1972, Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Law from 1972 to 1974; and Master of Robert Black College between 1979 and 1984.



The "Erik Kvan Memorial Fund" has been established to commemorate his life-long contributions to teaching and research at the University of Hong Kong. ## Mrs Dorothy Ada Collins,

Lecturer in the Department of Chemistry since 1948. Mrs Collins had a long association with the University. From 1961 until her retirement from the University in 1975, Mrs Collins was Warden of Duchess of Kent Hall. After retirement, Mrs Collins kept contact with the University as an honorary research fellow from 1975 until 1978 and honorary research associate from 1978 until June 2002.



Mrs Collins is well remembered and will be missed by many of her colleagues and students of the University. To commemorate her contributions, the "Dorothy Collins Memorial Fund" has been set up to award prizes and scholarships to students of the Department of Chemistry. ## Grace Wei Huang Memorial Fund

The Fund was established in June 1999, in memory of the late Mrs Grace Wei Huang 黃李威女士 (1924-1999), devoted wife of Dr Rayson Huang, Vice-Chancellor of the University from 1972-1986.

The Fund supports the "Grace Wei Huang Memorial Prize" for promotion of business studies in the University which consists of two kinds of award. The first is a scholarship presented to a Business undergraduate on the basis of academic merit. The other is a non-cash award to be presented each to a graduate of the HKU MBA Programme and a graduate of the HKU-Fudan University IMBA Programme, in recognition of outstanding academic performance.
