

Honorary Fellowships



The Honorary University Fellowships were created in 1995 as a mark of the distinction and esteem with which the recipients are held by the University and to better relationships with the community. Five outstanding individuals received the honour in December 2003.

The Hon Mr Justice Patrick Chan 陳兆愷 (LLB 1974; PCLL 1975) is Permanent Judge of the Court of Final Appeal. As an alumnus of the University, he has made many contributions to his alma mater. He is a member of the University's Council and has been actively involved in the review of the University's governance and management. In particular, he has rendered invaluable service to the Faculty of Law.



Mr Moses Cheng 鄭慕智 (LLB 1972; PCLL 1973) is a practicing solicitor. He has distinguished himself as an active member of the Hong Kong community. He is a former Legislative Councilor, a member of the Education Commission of Hong Kong, Chairman of the Council and Court of the Baptist University and a member of the Court and Convocation Standing Committee of HKU.



Professor Leung Nai Kong 梁乃江 (MBBS 1966) is a leading paediatrician and a former Chief Executive of Princess Margaret Hospital. He is an Honorary Professor in the Faculty of Medicine who has been actively involved in planning educational activities under the new medical curriculum and is a member of the Faculty's Medical Education Unit. Professor Leung has played an instrumental part in founding the University's Medical Alumni Association and has been a member of the Association's Executive Committee since its formation in 1999.



Mr Linus Cheung 張永霖 (BSocSc 1971, DipManStud 1978) has led a distinguished career in management. He is Deputy Chairman of PCCW and a former Deputy Managing Director of Cathay Pacific Airways and was Executive Director of Cable and Wireless plc in the United Kingdom. He has worked as a member of the HKU Council and is a member of its Finance Committee. He is the current President of the HKU Social Sciences Alumni Association.



Mr Lim Por Yen 林百欣 is a successful businessman and renowned philanthropist. He is founder of the Lai Sun Group. His generosity has seen him donate more than HK\$600 million to charity over the years. He has supported education, healthcare and culture in Hong Kong and China. He is one of the Founding Honorary Presidents of HKU Foundation. His donation of HK\$20 million was an enormous boost to the University's SARS Fund and to the establishment of the Jao Tsung-I Petite Ecole.



Loke Yew Hall






中國科學院院士

中國科學院院士是國家設立的科學技術方面的最高學術稱號，為終身榮譽；院士稱號授予那些在科學技術領域作出了系統的、創造性的成就和重大貢獻的學者。新當選的四位院士當中，兩位是任教於港大。其餘兩位院士分別是劉允怡教授 Joseph Lau (MBBS 1972) 及吳奇教授。

葉嘉安教授 Professor Anthony Yeh (BA 1974) 地理信息科學、城市規劃、城市地理學家。是港大城市規劃及環境管理研究中心講座教授、研究學院院長和香港註冊規劃師。中國最早從事地理信息系統研究專家之一。他很早已進行城市就業與居住位置的空間分析，證明新城鎮規劃的「自供自給」的不可行性。是第一位分析中國城市社會空間結構的學者之一，提出土地產權對城市發展和規劃的影響。



章梓雄教授 Professor Allen Chwang 流體力學、水動力學家。現任香港大學機械工程系何東機械工程講座教授及非線性力學中心主任。章教授多年來從事黏性流動、波浪理論、非線性水波、兩物體相互作用下的水動力學問題、通過多孔介質的流動、水下聲學、海港設計與研究等方面的研究工作。在流體力學學報 (Journal of Fluid Mechanics)、流體物理學報 (Physics of Fluids) 等國際著名學術期刊上發表學術論文二百七十多篇。

World's First China Brain Bank

Brain is the last frontier of research on the human body. Brain research relies heavily on animal models in the past as human brains are hard to access directly with most research tools. Although there are several important post-mortem brain banks in the world, these collections, however, are not accompanied by detail medical records or psychological profile of the patient which are important information to the interpretation of data.

In order to foster human brain research, intensify the understanding of diseases and encourage academic collaboration, the University of Hong Kong and Central South University have jointly established the world's first China Brain Bank with comprehensive medical record, and psychological profile of human kind.

The Brain Bank will be administered by both universities under a collaborative agreement. A signing ceremony was held on February 20. Donors will be recruited after informed consent for organ donation and will receive psychiatric/psychometric evaluations. Donated brains will be collected and stored according to established protocol.

Jao Tsung-I Petite Ecole 饒宗頤學術館

Professor Jao Tsung-I has generously donated a collection of his works and books to the University. In view of the volume (over 20,000 volumes) and value of the collection and, above all, the eminence of Professor Jao, the Jao Tsung-I Petite Ecole would serve as a gallery as well as a center for related research studies.



The establishment of the Jao Tsung-I Petite Ecole is a joint effort between various parties of the University, including the Libraries, the University Museum and Art Gallery, the Department of Chinese, and the Department of Fine Arts. The opening ceremony also commemorated the establishment of "Lim Por Yen Academic Fund" in support of the Jao Tsung-I Petite Ecole.


