## Report of HKUAAO President 2003/2004 AGM – August 22, 2004

I would like to start my report by saying that it is an honour and a privilege for me to be serving you as the President of the Association for the term 2003/2004. May I first of all wish our members and their families healthiness and happiness.

Our association has a history of excellence, built up and sustained by those who served before me. In the past year, I had been trying to continue this tradition to the best of my ability.

The Association's functions and activities in the past year were as follows:

1. Annual General Meeting and Barbeque Dinner – August 17, 2003

The function was held at Shangri-Li Banquet & Convention Centre in Markham. During the AGM, Timothy Cheng, our immediate past president, presented the annual Report 2002 – 2003 and a new Board of directors was elected. After the formal part of the AGM had been completed, Dr. Tam, an alumni member, gave an update on the research on osteoporosis.

Following the AGM, a barbeque dinner was arranged at the garden of the Convention Centre. Approximately 70 people (alumni members and their families) enjoyed the delicious dinner under a warm and relaxing environment. 3. HKSAR Secretary for Justice's Toronto Visit – November 19, 2004

Elise Leung, Secretary for Justice of the HKSAR Government, visited Toronto in November 2003. A luncheon was arranged by the Canadian Club of Toronto at Metro Toronto Convention Centre on November 19, 2003. Some of our Board

members had attended the luncheon and got an update on the laws under the principal of "one country, two systems".

In the evening of November 19, 2003, Hong Kong Economic & Trade Office ("HKETO") arranged for a reception for the Secretary for Justice to meet local Chinese community leaders. Our Association accepted the invitation made by HKETO. Dennis Au-Yeung and K.B. Ng represented our Association to attend the reception.

### 4. Spring Dinner 2004

We celebrated the Year of the Monkey on February 1, 2004 at the Time Square Dynasty Restaurant in Richmond Hill. It was a big gathering of old friends and new faces. HKU exchange students from all across Ontario got together to share the warmth and New Year wishes. We also had a record number of prizes for the lucky draw. Mr. Kenneth Cheng, Deputy Director of Hong Kong Economic & Trade Office conducted a speech on the current affairs and economic outlook of Hong Kong. Approximately 90 people attended the Spring Dinner. ### 6. Canadian Multi-Culture Council Asian Month Forum

As we did in 2003, we continued to support the Canadian Multi-Culture Council Asian Month Forum for 2004. On May 18, 2004, our Association was a cosponsor of the Asian Heritage Month Lecture chaired by Senator Vivienne Poy and presented by Haroon Siddiqui of the Toronto Star.

The 2004 International Joint Function of HKUAA was held in the United Kingdom. The arrangements were made by HKUAA UK Chapter. Dennis au-Yeung represented our Association to attend the function during July 2-3, 2004. The Reunion Dinner was held at the Ballroom of the Four Regions Chinese Restaurant, London on July 2, 2004. Professor Cheng Kai Ming, Pro-Vice Chancellor of HKU made a speech at the dinner. The dinner was attended by approximately 100 people, including Rayson Huang (Vice Chancellor of HKU in

70's) and alumni members from UK, Hong Kong, Singapore, Australia, Canada and USA.

On July 3, 2004, a tour of Stratford and Oxford was arranged. Approximately 40 people joined the tour and there were a lot of funs. The Closing Dinner of the International Joint Function was held at Phoenix Palace Restaurant, London and was attended by 40 people.
