## **Mentorship Program**

The HKU Mentorship Programme was established in 1997. Not only was it the first such program in Hong Kong's institutions of higher education, it was so successful that it had also become an exemplar of similar programs. HKUAAO is a strong supporter of the HKU's Mentorship Programme. For over 10 years, many of our alumni have volunteered to act as mentors to HKU exchange students ("mentees") who came to Canadian universities in Ontario and Quebec for one or two semesters under the HKU Worldwide Student Exchange Programme.

Often this may be the first time that the students are far away from home. Mentors can provide invaluable assistance to the mentees in helping them quickly settle down and adapt to their new environment. Over time, mentors and their mentees establish a unique relationship through which mentors will help provide guidance to enhance their mentee's development and at the same time gain insights into the younger generations' points of view. Through participation in the Mentorship Programme, mentors can maintain contact with academia and have the satisfaction of knowing that they are playing a role in the development of young inquisitive minds.

This Fall Term there are 21 exchange students coming to Ontario and Quebec, including University of Toronto, University of Western Ontario, University of Waterloo, Queen's University and McGill University. We are happy to report that we have a mentor for each one of them. We plan to invite all the mentees to join the October 14 hiking and dinner so that they have a chance to meet other fellow students and alumni while they enjoy the beautiful fall colours of Ontario.

The objective is to promote interest in this healthy activity and foster friendship among HKUAAO members and friends. The events are very popular.

This Fall we shall do a 13 km hike on mostly flat and variable terrain. We shall hike to Eaton Hall Lake and Mary Lake and stop at Pine Farms Orchard for refreshments and apple picking. Details are as follows.

DATE: Sunday October 14, 2012

**MEETING TIME AND PLACE**: Roadside parking on Keele Street, about 2.5 km north of King Road, King City. Please report to hike coordinators at 1:15pm.

#### **DIRECTION:**

<u>From the west</u> Take Hwy 400 Exit 43 to King Road. Go east on King Road to Keele Street and turn left (north). Stay on Keele Street, passing Sideroad 15 and meet at roadside parking on the right hand side road shoulder.

<u>From the east</u> Take Hwy 404 exit Bloomington Road. Continue west past Bathurst Street where Bloomington Road will become Sideroad 15. Turn right (north) on Keele Street. Travel for about 1km and meet at roadside parking on the right hand side of road shoulder.

As parking space is not plentiful, **CARPOOLING IS ENCOURAGED**.

COST: Nil for Hiking

**OPTIONAL DINNER PARTY**: After the hike, there is an optional dinner party at 7:00 pm at the Best Dragon Seafood Restaurant at 100 Steeles Ave W in

Thornhill. The cost will be about \$25 per person. Directions to the restaurant will be given out at end of the hike.




#### Karaoke - HKUAAO Got Talents
