#### **Farewell Bernadette**



This year's QS World University Ranking has come out. The top five universities are 1) MIT, 2) Cambridge, 3) Stanford, 4) Oxford, 5) Harvard. The top university in Asia is University of Singapore which is ranked no. 11. University of Hong Kong is no. 21. Other Asian universities in the top forty are Peking University, no. 12, Tsinghua no. 14, University of Tokyo no. 23, Seoul National University no. 29. Chinese University of Hong Kong is no. 38 and HKUScienceTechnology no. 40.
